AN ACT

TO AMEND THE ROYAL FIJI MILITARY FORCES ACT. (11/92)

[3 June, 1992]

ENACTED by the Parliament of Fiji.

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Royal Fiji Military Forces (Amendment) Act, 1992 and shall be deemed to have come into force on the 3rd day of June 1992.

Interpretation

2. In this Act the Royal Fiji Military Forces Act is referred to as "the principal Act".

Sections 18 and 19 amended

3. Sections 18 and 19 of the principal Act are amended by substituting the word "students" for the word "boys" in the fifth line of Section 18 and in the first line of Section 19 respectively.

A BILL

TO AMEND THE ROYAL FIJI MILITARY FORCES ACT

ENACTED by the Parliament of Fiji:

Short title

ROYAL FIJI MILITARY FORCES (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1992

OBJECTS AND REASONS

(These do not form part of the Bill and are intended only to indicate its general effect)

1. Due to increasing demand, Cadet Training has been extended to 28 schools in Fiji. It has resulted in the participation of female students in Cadet Training. The present law allows for the involvement of male students only.
2. Clause 1 contains the short title and commencement date.
3. Clause 2 is an interpretation provisions.
4. Clause 3 provides for the substitution of the word "students" for "boys" in Sections 18 and 19 of the Act to regularise the participation of females in cadet training.
5. The subject matter of this Bill is within the sphere of responsibility of the Minister for Home Affairs.
