AN ACT

To amend Public Law No. 8-18 by amending sections 1, 3, 5, 11, and 13 to appropriate the sum of \$5,624,196 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1994, as supplemental funding for the executive branch, the National judiciary, agencies, other National Government programs, grants, subsidies, contributions and refunds and the development budget; to amend section 14 to raise the employment ceiling; to amend section 15 with respect to overtime; to amend section 16(1) with respect to reprogramming; to amend section 17 with respect to the allottee; and for other purposes.
