

AN ACT

To appropriate a supplemental budget in the amount of \$593,396 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2015, by amending sections 1, 2, 3, 6, 8, 9, and 13 of Public Law No. 18-89, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 18-102, 18-110, 18-116, and 19-02 to change the conditions of certain funds therein, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 18-89, as amended
2 by Public Laws Nos. 18-102, 18-110, 18-116, and 19-02, is hereby
3 further amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to
5 appropriate the sum of \$99,046,644 from the General Fund
6 of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal
7 year ending September 30, 2015, for the purpose of
8 funding the operations of all branches of the National
9 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its
10 agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and
11 contributions and Capital and Human Resources
12 Development. The National Government's share of the
13 Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero except
14 that the National Government will retain ten percent
15 (10%) of the Supplemental Education Grant funds as is
16 reflected in the budget for the Department of Education.
17 The budget shall also include appropriations for COM-FSM

1 from sector grants as well as appropriations from
 2 amended Compact carry-over funds.”

3 Section 2. Section 2 of Public Law No. 18-89, as amended by
 4 Public Laws Nos. 18-102, 18-110, 18-116, and 19-02 is hereby
 5 further amended to read as follows:

6 “Section 2. Operating expenses of the Executive Branch.
 7 The sum of \$18,938,861, or so much thereof as may be
 8 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund
 9 of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal
 10 year ending September 30, 2015, for the purpose of
 11 funding the operations of the Executive Branch of the

21 Section 7. Section 13 of Public Law No. 18-89 is hereby
 22 amended to read as follows:

23 "Section 13. Allotment and management of funds and
 24 lapse dates.

25 (1) General provisions.

1 (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be
2 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in
3 accordance with applicable law, including, but not
4 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979.

5 (b) The allottees shall be responsible for
6 ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be
7 necessary, are used solely for the purposes specified in
8 this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess
9 of the sums appropriated.

10 (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds
11 appropriated by this act are as follows:

12 (a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds
13 shall be the President of the Federated States of
14 Micronesia;

15 (b) Section 3 - the allottee of these funds
16 shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated
17 States of Micronesia;

18 (c) Section 4 - the allottee of these funds
19 shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the
20 Federated States of Micronesia;

21 (d) Section 5 - the allottee of these funds
22 shall be the Public Auditor of the Federated States of
23 Micronesia;

24 (e) Sections 6 through 9 - the allottee of these
25 funds shall be the President of the Federated States of

1 Micronesia; PROVIDED HOWEVER, that for the following
2 subsections of sections 8 through 9 of this act:

3 (i) Section 8(6)(g) – the allottee shall be
4 the President of the College of Micronesia – FSM; and

5 (ii) Section 8, (13)(a) through (d) – the
6 allottee of these funds shall be the Chief Justice of
7 the respective State Supreme Court;

8 (iii) Section 8 (10)(a) through (i) – the
9 allottee of these funds shall be the Speaker of the
10 Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia; and

11 (iv) Section 9(1)(a) through (c) – the
12 allottee of these funds shall be the President of the
13 College of Micronesia-FSM.

14 (v) Section 9(4)(g), the allottee of these
15 funds shall be the Governor of Chuuk State.

16 (vi) Section 9(4)(i), the allottee of these
17 funds shall be the Governor of Yap State.

18 (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to
19 obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as
20 of September 30, 2015; PROVIDED HOWEVER, that the funds
21 appropriated under section 9 of this act shall not lapse
22 and the funds appropriated under sections 8(4) (r)–(y)
23 shall not lapse until September 30, 2016.”

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1 Section 8. This act shall become law upon approval by the
2 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
3 becoming law without such approval.
