PUBLIC LAW NO. 19-59

AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 18-117, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 18-120, 19-04, 19-08, 19-35 and 19-49, by amending sections 2, 5 and 6 thereof, to change the use and allottee of funds previously appropriated therein, for the purpose of funding public projects and social programs for the people of the states of Yap and Chuuk, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law No. 18-117, as amended by
2 Public Laws Nos. 19-04, 19-08 and 19-35, is hereby further amended
3 to read as follows:

4 "Section 2. Of the sum of \$2,800,000 appropriated by
5 this act, \$400,000 is apportioned for Yap State for
6 public projects and social programs.

21 Section 3. Section 6 of Public Law No. 18-117, as amended by
22 Public Law 19-04, is hereby amended to read as follows:

23 "Section 6. Allotment and management of funds and lapse
24 date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be
25 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in

1 accordance with applicable laws, including, but not
2 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. The
3 allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these
4 funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used
5 solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that
6 no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum
7 appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated
8 under section 2 of this act shall be the Governor of Yap
9 State; PROVIDED THAT, the allottee of funds appropriated
10 under subsection 2(i) shall be the President of COM-FSM.
11 The allottee of funds appropriated under sections 3 and
12 4 of this act shall be the President of the Federated
13 States of Micronesia or his designee, PROVIDED THAT, the
14 allottee of funds appropriated under sections
15 3(a)(b)(c)(d)(e)(f)(g)(h)(i)(j)(k)(l) and (m) shall be
16 the Mayor of Lelu Town Government; the allottee of funds
17 appropriation under sections 4(3)(a) and 4(3)(f) of this
18 act shall be the Pohnpei Transportation Authority; the
19 allottee of funds appropriated under section 4(3)(h) of
20 this act shall be the Meninkeden Lapalap of Madolenimw
21 and the allottee of funds appropriated under section
22 4(3)(i) of this act shall be the Luhkenmoanlap of Kitti.
23 The allottee of funds appropriated under subsections
24 5(1), 5(3) and 5(6) of section 5 of this act shall be
25 the Governor of Chuuk State or his designee. The

1 allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 5(2) of
2 section 5 of this act shall be the Mortlock Islands
3 Development Authority. The allottee of funds
4 appropriated under subsection 5(4) of section 5 of this
5 act shall be the Southern Namoneas Development
6 Authority. The allottee of funds appropriated under
7 subsection 5(5) of section 5 of this act shall be the
8 Faichuk Development Authority. The authority of the
9 allottee to obligate funds appropriated by this act to
10 the States of Chuuk, Kosrae and Pohnpei shall lapse on
11 September 30, 2016. All funds appropriated to Yap State
12 that are not allotted by May 1, 2016, shall be deposited
13 into the Yap State Trust Fund. The allottee of the
14 funds appropriated under section 2 of this act for Yap
15 State shall report proof of deposit to Congress of the
16 Federated States of Micronesia within 30 days from
17 depositing funds into the Yap State Trust Fund.”

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1 Section 4. This act shall become law upon approval by the
2 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
3 becoming law without such approval.
