Tort Law in Mauritius

Goran Georgijevic and Jonas Knetsch (Wolters Kluwer, 2024) pp 1-137

This monograph provides a comprehensive overview of the law of delict in Mauritius. The work reflects the strong influence of the Civil Code of Mauritius, a successor to the Code Napoleon, and provides a good picture of the unique position of Mauritius and its mixed legal heritage.

The 2010 Constitutional Reform in Tonga

Mele Tupou Vaitohi (CLJP, Wellington, 2025) pp *i-viii*, 1-238 (incl appendices 203-234)

This work provides a study of the devolution of executive authority from monarchy to representative government in a Polynesian society. The focus is on the 2010 Constitutional Law Reforms in Tonga and on the background to them and the political activities involved in managing the changes.
