Politically, Kili Island is not associated with Bikini Atoll in receiving money from the U.S Government. Kili Island, as of today is still a public land. Therefore, the people live and enjoy the land, but they are not the owner.

Then, how can the parties in this caption matter claim that the "southern tip of Kili Island is theirs? Not one of them is the rightful owner.
