L. 2003-105 5 6 AN ACT 7 8 To provide -9 (a) in accordance with Article VIII of the Constitution, for the issue from the 10 Marshall Islands General Fund, including funds provided under the Compact of Free Association, 11 as Amended, grants and other funds, of a total sum of US \$108,627,669 to meet the expenditures 12 of the Government for the Financial Year 2004, and to appropriate sums to program areas; and 13 (b) for a Contingencies Fund in accordance with Section 9 of Article VIII of the 14 Constitution; and 15 (c) for contingent appropriation of amounts that may be received in the future; and 16 (d) for delegation of expenditure approval under Section 5 of Article VIII of the 17 Constitution; and 18 (e) for controls on reprogramming and transfer of funds within appropriation 19 areas; and 20 (f) for control on specific expenditures. 21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE NITIJELA OF THE MARSHALL ISLANDS: 22 Section 1. Short Title. 23 This Act may be cited as the Appropriations (Financial Year 2004) Act, 2003, and shall 24 be deemed to have come into effect on 1 October, 2003. 25 Section 2. Statement of National Objective. 26 It is the intention of the Government of the Republic of the Marshall Islands to 27 hereby enact and implement a national budget for the whole of the Financial Year 2004. 28 Section 3. Interpretation. 29

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1	In this Act -
2	(1) "program area" means program areas set out in Schedules 2, 3 and 4 as
3	indicated by the headings in those schedules
4	(2) "unanticipated income" means any money, not being loan money, that -
5	(a) becomes available for expenditure from a source at a time when the
6	Nitijela is not meeting; and
7	(b) has not been specifically included in the budget estimates for the
8	Financial Year, which the Cabinet is satisfied should, in the interests of the Republic of the
9	Marshall Islands, be expended, in whole or in part, before the expenditure could reasonably
10	be authorized by an Appropriation Act or a Supplementary Appropriation Act.
11	Section 4. Appropriations from the Marshall Islands General Fund.
12	(1). General Fund Appropriation. The sum of \$30,795,861 is hereby
13	appropriated, and may be withdrawn from the Marshall Islands General Fund and expended
14	pursuant to Article VIII of the Constitution for program areas as set out in schedules 2,
15	(attached herewith).
16	(2) Compact Funds; All Funds provided under the Compact of Free Association
17	as Amended, in the amount of \$57,700,000 shall be credited to the General Fund and shall be
18	appropriated in accordance with the relevant provisions and schedules of this Act.
19	
20	(3) Restrictions on Reprogramming of Compact Funds. Funds received under the
21	Compact of Free Association as Amended, shall not, during the Financial Year, be transferred to

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any other activity, or reprogrammed or expended for any purpose other than the permissible uses of those funds as provided for in the Compact of Free Association as Amended and its Subsidiary Agreements.

- (4) <u>Lapse of Compact Funds</u>. All moneys received under the Compact of Free Association, as Amended, and appropriated herein shall not lapse at the end of the Financial Year, but shall continue until either the purpose of the appropriation is completed or funds are expended, whichever occurs first.
- organization receiving funds under the Compact of Free Association, or Compact of Free Association as Amended, shall not receive such funding if the Auditor General or its contractors have determined that the books, accounts and financial records of any such entity or organization have not been auditable for the past three preceding fiscal years until such time as the Auditor General or its contractors determine that such entity or organization has taken necessary corrective action to render such books, accounts and financial records in an auditable condition to permit a financial audit to proceed.

Section 5. Appropriation of U.S. Federal Grants and Other Foreign Grants.

(1) The sum of \$15,000,000 (being the total amount of special U.S. Federal Grants and other foreign grants) is appropriated and may be withdrawn from the Marshall Islands General Fund pursuant to Article VIII of the Constitution, for program areas in accordance with Schedule 4, during the Financial Year.

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(2) The amounts set out in Schedule 4 and 5 are not available for expenditure as reprogrammed expenditure under Article VIII Section 7 of the Constitution, except as authorized by or under the agreements with the donor nation.

(3)The appropriation made by Subsection (1) shall not lapse at the end of the Financial Year, but shall continue until either the grant expires or the funds are expended, whichever occurs first.

Section 6. Funding of the Office of the Auditor-General.

The Secretary of Finance shall withhold and deposit in a special account in the Marshall Islands General Fund, one half of one percent (0.5%) of all amounts appropriated in Schedule 2 and the sum so withheld and deposited may be withdrawn and expended by the Auditor-General in accordance with the budget approved for his/her office by the Cabinet, for the operations and activities of his office.

Section 7. Contingencies Fund.

- (1) In accordance with Article VIII, Section 9 of the Constitution, there is hereby established a Contingencies Fund.
- (2) The amount of the Contingencies Fund prescribed, for the duration of the Financial Year, for the purposes of Article VIII, Section 9(1) of the Constitution is \$200,000.
- (3) Where, during the Financial Year, an amount of unanticipated income is received by the Government for the purpose of an urgent and unforeseen need, the amount prescribed in Subsection (2) for the Contingencies Fund is increased by the amount of that unanticipated income, to meet such need.

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Section 8.	Unar	iticipated	l income.
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Where, during the Financial Year, an amount of unanticipated income is received by the Government for a specified program area, otherwise than as set out in Section 7(3), that amount is appropriated for the corresponding program area in Schedules as the case may be, and the amount of the appropriation for that program area is increased accordingly.

Section 9. Notification by Minister

When any money to which Section 7(3) or Section 8 applies is received, the Minister of Finance shall notify the Cabinet of the receipt of such money, and such money shall not be expended without the approval of the Cabinet.

Section 10. Lapsing of Certain Appropriations.

Any increase in the amount prescribed for the Contingencies Fund provided for by Section 7(3) ceases and any increase in the amount of an appropriation affected by Section 8 lapses -

- (a) on the effective date of the next Appropriation Act or Supplementary Appropriation Act enacted after the date referred to in Subsection (1); or
- (b) on the adoption of a Resolution to that effect by the Nitijela, whichever occurs first.

Section 11. Delegation of Authority to Approve.

(1) For the purposes of Article VIII, Section 5(1) of the Constitution, the authority to approve expenditure in a program area in accordance with Schedules 2, 3, and 4, is hereby delegated to;

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1	(a) the member of the Cabinet primarily responsible for that program area;
2	and
3	(b) if the responsible member of the Cabinet so directs by instrument in
4	writing, and subject to any limitations imposed by the instrument and to general control by the
5	member, an appropriate person, authority, or agency.
6	(2) The Chief Justice of the High Court is hereby vested with the authority to
7	approve expenditure of the Judiciary Fund in accordance with the provisions of 27 MIRC
8	Chapter 1.
9	(3) Any expenditure otherwise than in accordance with Schedules 2, 3 and 4 shall
10	require the approval of the Cabinet in accordance with Article VIII, Section 5(1) of the Constitution.
11	Section 12. Reprogramming and Transfers Between and Within Program Areas.
12	Before any reprogramming of expenditure between program areas is approved
13	under Article VIII, Section 7(1)(b) of the Constitution, the Cabinet shall approve such
1.4	reprogramming.
15	Section 13. General.
16	(1)In the event the actual receipts into the Marshall Islands General Fund fall short
17	of the amounts anticipated in the schedules 6, 7, 8 and 9, the Cabinet may make the necessary
18	adjustments to schedules 2, 3 and 4 to accommodate the shortfall.
19	(2). All contracts awarded by the Government or associated agencies must comply
20	with the procedures set out in the RMI Procurement Code. Funds will only be released by the
21	Ministry of Finance upon proof of compliance with the code.

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(3). Gross Revenue Tax of 3% on all Government contracts will be with held
by the Ministry of Finance at the time of payment, and credited against the contrators liability to
pay gross reveue tax for the period of the payment. The contractor is still required to file a tax
return for the period.
(4). All Government Ministries and Departments must have been audited and
have complied with all audit recommendations prior to reciving any quarterly allocation. Any
Ministry or Department unable to comply with all audit requirements must provide an expence
report before release of any funds.
Section 14. Special Revenue Funds.
The sum of \$5,131,808 (total special revenue funds) is deemed appropriated and
shall be disbursed in accordance with the provisions of the Acts establishing such special revenue
funds. Any moneys in excess of an appropriation made in Schedule 3 (Special Revenue Funds)
shall likewise, be expended during the Financial Year only in accordance with the provisions of
the Act establishing such Special Revenue Fund.
Section 15. Effective Date.
This Act shall take effect on the date of certification in accordance with Article IV,
Section 21 of the Constitution.
