

THE ISLAND OF NAURU.

No. 6 of 1934

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Customs Tariff Amendment Ordinance 1922-1932.

I, the Administrator of the Island of Nauru do hereby enact order and proclaim as under :-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Ordinance 1934 and shall come into operation on and from eight o'clock in the forenoon of the second day of July, 1934.

2. The Customs Tariff Amendment Ordinance 1922 as amended by the Customs Tariff Amendment Ordinance 1924 and as further amended by the Customs Tariff Amendment Ordinance 1932, is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

3. The Principal Ordinance as amended by this Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Ordinance 1922-1934.

4. By this Ordinance :-

(a) The schedule of import duties as embodied in the Principal Ordinance is cancelled and the following schedule substituted therefor :-

7. Cider and Perry, spirituous .. - " "	1s. 3d.
8. Bicycles (new or partly used) .. each	£1.
9. Motor bicycles (new or partly used) ... .. "	£2.
10. Side cars for Motor cycles (new or partly used).. .. "	£1.
11. Motor cars (new or partly used). "	£5.
12. Perfumed spirits and bay rum .. .. ad val. 15%	
13. All other goods not included in the duty free list . ad val. 10%	

For the purpose of items 4 to 7 inclusive, hereinbefore specified -

(a) Six reputed quarts or 12 reputed pints or 24 reputed half-pints shall be assessed as 1 gallon.

- (b) 'Spirituous' means containing more than two per cent of proof spirit;
- (c) 'Proof' or 'proof spirit' means spirit of a strength equal to that of pure ethyl alcohol compounded with distilled water so that the resultant mixture at a temperature of 60° Fahrenheit has a specific gravity of 0.91976 as compared with that of distilled water at the same temperature."

(b) The Free List as embodied in the Principal Ordinance is amended as follows :-

- (1) Item No. 11 is cancelled and in its place is substituted -

"Item 11 - Carpenters and Engineers Tools and all other tools of trade."

- (2) In Item 12 para. 2 third line the amount "£100" is substituted for £50.

- (3) In item 24 "Culinary essences of all kinds" is substituted for "Essences."

- (4) Item 21 is cancelled and the following substituted -

"Item 21 - timber and all building materials including stone, iron, doors, window sashes, nails, screws, glass, bathroom and sanitary fixtures and fittings, locks including padlocks and paints and coloring matter."

- (5) The undermentioned items are added to the Free List and follow after item 25 -

- "Item 26 - Soap of all kinds.  
 27 - Washing soda  
 28 - Starch  
 29 - Washing blue  
 30 - Stationery  
 31 - Materials other than clothing and footwear for outdoor sports including cricket, tennis, football, golf, shooting etc. but not including materials for indoor games.  
 32 - All musical instruments including pianos player, pianos and music rolls, gramophones, and gramophone records and parts and accessories thereof.  
 33 - Radio receiving sets and parts and accessories thereof  
 34 - Rat traps and all other devices for destroying vermin.
