**BE IT ENACTED** by the Parliament of Nauru as follows:

**SHORT TITLE**

1. This Act may be cited as the Supply Act 2003.

**INTERPRETATION**

- 2: In this Act :

“estimates” means the estimates of revenue and expenditure of the Republic for the financial year as contained in the “Estimates of Revenue and Expenditure” prepared and laid before the Parliament in pursuance of Article 59 (4) of the Constitution.

“the schedule” means the Schedule of Expenditure Authorised for the financial quarter ending thirtieth September, two thousand and three.

“the Treasury Fund” means the fund established under Article 58 of the Constitution of the Republic of Nauru.

“the financial year” means the year commencing on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July Two Thousand and Three and ending on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of June Two Thousand and Four, inclusive of both dates.

“head” means a department or division of the Expenditure of the Republic listed in the Schedule to this Act.

“subhead” means a subdivision of a head appearing in the estimates.

## **COMMENCEMENT AND EXPIRY**

- 3: This Act shall come into force on the first day of July, Two Thousand and Three and shall cease to have effect on the thirtieth day of September, Two Thousand and Three.

## **WITHDRAWAL OF MONEYS FROM THE TREASURY FUND**

- 4: (1) Total sum not exceeding 11,198,100 ( Dollars Eleven Million One Hundred Ninety Eight Thousand One Hundred ) as authorized in the Schedule may be withdrawn from the Treasury Fund and expended in accordance with the estimates, to meet the expenditure of the Republic until this Act shall cease to have effect in accordance with Section 3.
- (2) Where the Cabinet considers it necessary to increase the amount assigned in the estimates to a particular subhead within a head, the Cabinet may direct that there shall be applied to the aid of that subhead a further sum out of any surplus arising on any other subhead within the same Head, but so that the total amount withdrawn and expended does not exceed the amount authorized for that Head in the Schedule to this Act :

provided that where the Cabinet authorizes a transfer of funds between subheads within a head in accordance with this sub-section it shall cause to be laid before the Parliament, at the first meeting of the Parliament after it has approved the transfer, a copy of the order of the Cabinet approving such transfer.

## **NAURU HOUSING FUND**

- 5: Where moneys are withdrawn from the Treasury Fund and expended as authorised in the estimates for the erection, maintenance and repair of Nauruan Housing, the Treasury Fund shall be reimbursed from the Nauru Housing Fund to the extent of the expenditure and the Nauru Housing Fund hereby charged accordingly.

## **INCOME FROM NAURUAN HOUSING**


- 6: All deposits, purchase moneys, rentals, interests and other moneys paid in respect of the erection, maintenance or repair of Nauruan Housing provided in accordance with the expenditure authorised by Section 4 or the disposal of any assets acquired in connection therewith, shall be paid to the Nauru Housing Fund.


