AIR HOSTESS TRAINING

Applications are called for a number of candidates to undertake a training course for Air Hostess in Australia. Applications should be forwarded to the Public Service Commissioner at the Chief Secretary's Office, Administrative Building, and must be received no later than 12 noon, Monday 12 June 1972.

Applicants -

- (1) must be over 18 years
- (2) under 9 stone in weight,
- (3) must forward information on education standard and present employment, and
- (4) should be bright, of good character and have a smart appearance.

Present members of the Public Service will be given consideration to attend the training course. Interviews will be conducted on either 13 or 14 June, 1972, and successful applicants must be prepared to travel to Melbourne on Friday, 16 June, 1972.

The Public Service Commissioner wishes it to be made clear that applicants chosen for the course do not necessarily thereby gain employment in the Public Service. Candidates undertaking a successful course, however, will be considered for future service in Air Nauru either on a permanent or relief basis.

Appropriate allowances will be paid for attendance at the Air Hostess Training Course.

<u>POSITION</u>	Craft Teacher (Secondary School)
