AN ORDINANCE

To Grant and Apply a Sum out of the Revenues of the Territory to the Service of the Year ended the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and to appropriate the Supplies already Granted for such Year.

WHEREAS there has been expended for the Service Preamble. of the year ended the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six a Sum for certain necessary Services in excess of the sums authorized by the *Appropriation Ordinance, 1925-1926* to be expended for the said Services which additional expenditure was not foreseen at the time of the passing of the said Ordinance: And whereas it is desirable and necessary that the said Ordinance should be repealed and that the moneys thereby authorized to be expended together with the said additional expenditure should be sanctioned by an Appropriation: Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Territory of Papua with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Appropriation Ordinance (No. 1), 1925-1926.

Issue and application, £159,034½.

1. The Treasurer may issue out of the Revenues of the Territory and apply towards making good the supply thereby granted to His Majesty for the Service of the Year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six the sum of One Hundred and Thirty-nine Thousand and Thirty-four Pounds, Ten Shillings.

Appropriation of supplies, £164,034½.

2. In addition to the sum of Twenty-five Thousand Pounds granted by the *Supply Ordinance, 1925-1926*, all sums granted by the last preceding section of this Ordinance out of the Revenues of the Territory towards making good the supply granted His Majesty amounting in the aggregate to the sum of One Hundred and Sixty-four Thousand and Thirty-four Pounds, Ten Shillings, are appropriated and shall be deemed to be appropriated as from the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five for the purposes and services expressed in the First Schedule.

Advances for the purposes of the Second Schedule.

3. In addition to the sum specified in the First Schedule to this Ordinance the Treasurer may issue and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the year ended on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six as advances for the purposes set forth in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance any sum or sums not exceeding the aggregate sum appearing in the said Second Schedule.

Appropriation of Loan and Grant Funds, £20,704½.

4. The Treasurer may issue out of the Loan and Grant Funds of the Territory towards the Service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six the sums mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto for the purposes specified therein.

Officers indemnified.

5. The Lieutenant-Governor and the Treasurer and all other officers are hereby indemnified against all claims and liabilities in respect of the issue and application of the said sums without the previous authority of an Appropriation Ordinance.

Repeal.

6. The whole of the *Appropriation Ordinance, 1925-1926* (No. 13 of 1925) is hereby repealed as from the time when this Ordinance is deemed to have come into operation.

Appropriation Ordinance (No. 1), 1925-1926.

7. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Appropriation Ordinance (No. 1), 1925-1926.* Short title.
