

STATUTORY RULES.

No. 7 of 1930.

Made under *The Native Regulation Ordinance of 1908.*

The *Native Regulations, 1922* (Statutory Rules No. 3 of 1922), are further amended as follows:—

1. By inserting therein immediately after Regulation 94 thereof the following new regulation and heading:—

“Reduction of mosquito-borne diseases.

94A. (1) Water shall not be allowed to lie in canoes near villages in such a way as to breed or be likely to breed mosquitoes.

(2) A Magistrate, Village Constable, Government Medical Officer or a Medical Assistant may order the removal of any such water.

(3) Any native who wilfully refuses or neglects to obey any order given in pursuance of this Regulation shall upon conviction before a Magistrate be liable to a fine not exceeding One pound or in default of payment to imprisonment for any period not exceeding two months or to imprisonment in the first instance for any period not exceeding two months.”
