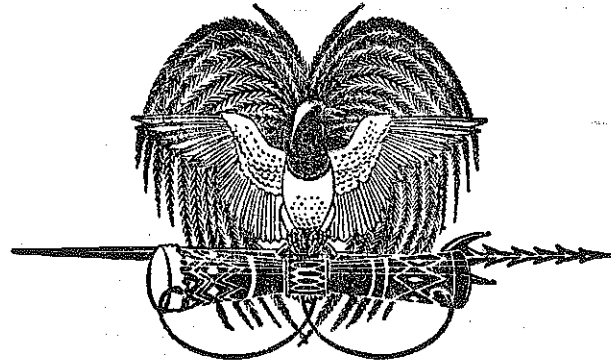

MADE by the Price Controller under the *Prices Regulations Act* (Chapter 320) to come into operation on 1st January, 1988.**SCHEDULE 15****TELECOMMUNICATION TARIFF DIRECTORY****1.0 GENERAL INFORMATION****1.1 Tariffs and Conditions—**

The conditions and service charges contained in this Tariff Directory are subject to change from time to time. Queries on the approval of tariffs should be directed to the Deputy Price Controller, Department of Finance and Planning. Enquiries on the administration of tariffs and provision of services should be directed to the Executive Manager, Marketing and Customer Services of the Post and Telecommunication Corporation (PTC).

**1.2 Payment in Advance—**

Customers applying for telecommunication services are required to make payment of the connection fee in advance before services can be provided. All applications are subject to PTC credit approvals and a deposit of an amount determined by PTC, may be required before service will be provided.

**1.3 Payment of Accounts—**

PTC accounts are issued every 28 days and should be paid immediately. All accounts remaining unpaid 28 days from the date of issue will be subject to disconnection of service without further notice. Accounts remaining unpaid following a further 28 days will be subject to cancellation of service.

**1.4 Government Telephone Tax—**

The *Telephone Tax Act* 1983, requires PTC to charge K3.00 for every billed exchange telephone line and to remit this money to the Chief Collector of Taxes. This directory does not include this tax, or any other Government Telecommunications Tax, which may be added or altered from time to time. Reference should be made to the Act or the Taxation office for details of those services provided with exemption under this Act.

**1.5 Insurance—**

Customers are liable for loss or damage of any telephone, telex, data or other equipment supplied by PTC, including the portion of the telephone line(s) on their premises. These items remain the property of PTC and should be included as a separate item(s) in the subscriber's Insurance Policies.

**1.6 Approved Attachments—**

Privately owned equipment may be connected to PTC services provided that:

1. The equipment has been previously type approved by PTC;
2. A permit to connect has been issued by PTC; and
3. The equipment is connected by PTC or PTC authorised agent.

All matters relating to type approval should be addressed to the Manager, Customer Equipment of PTC. A non-refundable K20.00 application fee applies for each item submitted for type approval. (N.B. Subscribers will be charged a minimum visit fee of K30.00 for any reported faults which are found to originate in privately owned equipment).

**1.7 Unauthorised use of Services—**

Telephone regulations provide that a person or company moving into premises and using a telephone or other PTC service without first having that service transferred into their name may become liable for all outstanding amounts due on that service.

**1.8 Right of Access—**

Government regulations provide PTC personnel with right of access to subscribers premises for purposes of inspection or maintenance of services or recovery of PTC equipment in the event of cancellation of service.

**1.9 Directory Entries—**

A subscriber is entitled to one free entry in the white page section of the Official Papua New Guinea Telephone Directory for each address to which a service is connected. Business subscribers are also entitled to one standard entry in the Yellow Pages for each address served.

## 2.1 Exchange Line Services—

The following charges apply to those services provided via existing external plant cabling to locations within an area defined as the Base Rate Area for each telephone exchange. Maps of the Base Rate Area are available for examination at PTC's Local District Offices or at the Boroko Office, telephone 274285. Within the Base Rate Area, connection between the telephone set location and PTC street cabling will normally be supplied at no extra cost provided the cable distance does not exceed 50 metres.

For distances of up to 500 metres, PTC will supply and install the lead-in wires at no additional charge if the applicant will undertake to provide aerial lead-in support poles or underground protective pipe to PTC Standards.

The provision of all telephone services beyond 500 metres, or outside the exchange Base Rate Area, shall be by prior written quotation only.

## Notes—

1. The cost of installation of the first standard telephone instrument on a Basic Exchange Line Service is included in the exchange line services "Install" fee, see Section 2.1 above. Certain types of instruments attract an additional cost on the installation fee, and these are shown above in the column headed "Initial phone".
2. The charges under "Extension phone" cover the cost of installation of the initial instrument on an extension. The same charge applies for the change-over of an existing main or extension instrument, at the subscribers request. This charge does not apply if the change-over is required for PTC reasons.
3. The "4 weekly rental" is in addition to the rental charged for the exchange line service listed in para 2.1 above.
4. A minimum charge of K30.00 is applicable if services are ordered as additions to existing extensions.

## 2.2.2 Sale, Exchange and Rental of Standard Extension Telephones.

Sale—Standard telephone instruments may be rented (at the above rate), or sold to approved PABX Contractors, or to PABX customers, for use as extensions on PTC type approved and inspected PABX's, at the following charges:

Exchange of Instrument for Maintenance—Each telephone sold will have a sticker attached which indicates the date sold by PTC., the labels are supplied by PTC's Marketing & Customer Services. Telephones sold are guaranteed for 12 months from the date sold, and will be exchanged for the same type free of charge, if returned with an intact label within the 12 months.

Extension telephones will also be exchanged free of charge, if the change is required for PTC purposes, for example conversion to DTMF signalling. All other change-overs will be on the following basis:—

Rotary telephones

a credit of K5 per instrument, to be used to purchase a new rotary line telephone only.

## Rental—Contractor Installations.

Rental is not charged for extension telephones supplied by PTC for Contractor supplied PABX's, as these telephones are sold to the Contractors.

Note—Only standard telephones are sold to Contractors.

## PTC Installations.

Normal rental, as detailed in para 2.2.1, is charged for telephones supplied on PTC installations of Business Communication Systems as listed in para 2.3. When systems require special telephones, or have optional special operators telephones etc., the rental for these telephones is listed under the appropriate system in para 2.3.

## 2.4.1 PABX SERVICES

PTC has approved a range of PABX systems as being safe to use, and suitable for installation in PNG. PABX systems in PNG may only be supplied and installed by PTC or PTC approved contractors. Business customers may negotiate directly with approved contractors for the supply and installation of PABX systems, however, an application for PABX service must be submitted to PTC for approval once requirements are known. Contractor's charges to their customers should cover the provision and installation of the PABX operator's console, the switching equipment, extension wiring, and supply and connection of extension telephones. Reference should be made to section 2.2.2 of this Directory for costs associated with PTC supplied telephone instruments. Government Departments are obliged to tender for PABX equipment through PTC.

## 2.4.2. PABX AND PMBX Maintenance

## Contractor Supplied Systems

PTC will inspect and test each Contractor installed PABX prior to placing it in service. PTC will then arrange either directly or through approved contractors, for maintenance of the PABX, internal cabling, and extension telephones. Charges for this service are based upon the equipped extension capacity of the PABX, as determined by PTC, as follows:

2.5.3. *Paging Service*

Paging units are purchased from PTC, and remain the property of the buyer. The service fee covers any maintenance required due to failure of components in the first three years. Thereafter the maintenance arrangement will be negotiated again. Physical damage due to mis-use or accident is not covered.

Tone and Numeric pagers are available wherever there is a paging service. Alpa-numeric pagers can be obtained for special use, subject to quotation. No connection fee applies to any pager.

2.6. *ALTERATION AND REMOVAL CHARGES*2.6.1. *Alterations to existing services*

Alterations or additions to existing telephone services are subject to the charges detailed in this directory. A minimum charge of K30.00 will be applied in all cases where a visit to customer premises is required.

2.6.2. *Change of Service Address*

The removal of an operating service to a new address will be charged at the new service rates detailed here-in. In the event an intact service of a suitable type is already installed at the new address, only line connection fees will be charged. Any changes or additions to this intact service will be subject to standard tariffs as well as line connection charges.

2.6.3. *Building rewiring*

Replacement of wiring worn out through normal we renovations, etc., will be subject to standard installation out as a result of deliberate damage, carpet laying, buildingar and tear will be carried out at no cost. Rewiring carried charges.

2.6.4. *Change of Telephone Number*

Requests for a change of telephone service number resulting from continued malicious phone calls will be carried out at no charge if the request is accompanied by a copy of the related Police report. All other requests for number change will be subject to standard connection fees.

2.6.5. *Change of Name*

Where a request is received to change the name of an account, it is to be treated as a cancellation, and a new account, with appropriate fees being charged. The change of an account name will be effected without charge only in the following cases:

1. Where the subscribers name is legally changed by deed poll or marriage.
2. Where the trading name of a Company is changed by amendment to the constitution of the Company.
