The Salaries and Remuneration Commission (Amendment) Law 1991

Being a Law to alter the Constitution (Salaries and Remuneration Commission),

MADE by the National Parliament.

1. The Salaries and Remuneration Commission (Amendment of Section 216A).

Section 216A of the Constitution is amended—

(a) in Subsection (2), by adding the following new paragraph—

“(g) two employees representatives who shall be selected in accordance with a procedure specified in an Organic Law or an Act of Parliament.”; and

(b) in Subsection (3), by adding the following new paragraph—

“(e) the salaries, allowances and benefits, financial or otherwise (including pensions or retirement benefits if they are not provided by law other than this provision) for the holders of such offices not included in paragraphs (a) to (d) inclusive as are declared by an Organic Law or an Act of Parliament to be offices for the purposes of this Division.”; and

(c) in Subsection (6)(a), by adding the following new sub-paragraph—

“(v) such other office-holders as are declared by an Organic Law or an Act of Parliament to be office-holders for the purposes of this Division.”.
