Public Services (Management) Act 1995

ABOLITION OF DEPARTMENTS AND ESTABLISHMENT OF DEPARTMENTS AND ALTERATION OF NAME OF DEPARTMENT; AND

ABOLITION OF OFFICES OF DEPARTMENTAL HEAD AND ESTABLISHMENT OF OFFICES OF DEPARTMENTAL HEAD AND ALTERATION OF DESIGNATION OF OFFICE OF DEPARTMENTAL HEAD; AND

AMENDMENT OF DETERMINATION OF FUNCTIONS OF DEPARTMENTS.

I, Wiwa Korowi, G.C.M.G., K.St.J., Governor-General, by virtue of the powers conferred by Sections 20, 21, and 22 of the *Public Services (Management) Act 1995* and all other powers me enabling, acting with, and in accordance with, the advice of the National Executive Council, hereby, with effect on and from the date of publication of this instrument in the *National Gazette*:—

(a) abolish the following Departments:—

- (i) Department of Corrective Institutional Services; and
- (ii) Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade; and
- (iii) Department of Mining and Petroleum; and

(b) establish the following Departments:—

- (i) Department of Bougainville Affairs; and
- (ii) Department of Foreign Affairs; and
- (iii) Department of Mineral Resources; and
- (iv) Department of National Planning and Implementation; and
- (v) Department of Petroleum and Energy; and
- (vi) Department of Trade; and

(c) alter the name of the Department of Labour and Employment to the Department of Industrial Relations; and

(d) abolish the following offices of Departmental Heads:—

- (i) Departmental Head of the Department of Corrective Institutional Services; and
- (ii) Departmental Head of the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade; and
- (iii) Departmental Head of the Department of Mining and Petroleum; and

Abolition of Departments and Establishment of Departments and Alteration of Name of Department; and Abolition of Offices of Departmental Head and Establishment of Offices of Departmental Head and Alteration of Designation of Office of Departmental Head; and

Amendment of Determination of Functions of Departments—*continued*

- (e) establish the following offices of the Departmental Head:—
 - (i) Departmental Head of the Department of Bougainville Affairs; and
 - (ii) Departmental Head of the Department of Foreign Affairs; and
 - (iii) Departmental Head of the Department of Mineral Resources; and
 - (iv) Departmental Head of the Department of National Planning and Implementation; and
 - (v) Departmental Head of the Department of Petroleum and Energy; and
 - (vi) Departmental Head of the Department of Trade; and
- (f) alter the designation of the office of Departmental Head of the Department of Labour and Employment to Departmental Head of the Department of Industrial Relations; and
- (g) revoke all previous Determinations of Functions of the Department of Personnel Management and determine that the functions of the Department of Personnel Management are as set out in Column 2 of Schedule 17 hereto; and
- (h) in relation to Departments other than the Department of Personnel Management, after consideration of reports made to the National Executive Council by the Departmental Head of the Department of Personnel Management, revoke all previous Determinations of Functions of Departments and determine that the Department specified in Column 1 of each Schedule hereto has the functions set out in Column 2 of that Schedule.

CONSTITUTION

DETERMINATION OF TITLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF MINISTERS

I, Bill Skate, Prime Minister, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 148 of the *Constitution* and all other powers me enabling, hereby:—

- (a) revoke all previous Determinations of Titles and Responsibilities of Ministers; and
- (b) determine that each Minister set out in Column 1 of each Schedule shall have:—
 - (i) the title specified in Column 1; and
 - (ii) the responsibilities specified in Column 2; and
 - (iii) the responsibilities for administering the Acts (or part of an Act) specified in Column 3, and set out opposite the name of the Minister,

to come into effect on and from the date of signature of this instrument.
