CONSTITUTION

AMENDMENT OF DETERMINATION OF TITLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF MINISTERS

I, Michael Thomas Somare, Prime Minister, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 148 of the Constitution and all other powers me enabling, hereby amend the Determination of Titles and Responsibilities of Ministers dated 13th September, 2007 and published in the *National Gazette* No. G145 of 13th September, 2007—

(a) in Schedule 13 (Minister for Community Development)—

(i) in Column 4 by deleting the following:—

“*Places of Entertainment Act*” (Chapter 319);
 “*Professional Boxing Control Board Act 1981*”;
 “*Papua New Guinea Sports Commission Act 1992*”,
 “*South Pacific Games (1991) Foundation Act 1989*”; and

(ii) in Column 3 by deleting Paragraphs (b), (f) and (h); and

(b) in Schedule 20 (Minister for State assisting the Prime Minister)—

(i) in Schedule 20 by deleting the words “Minister for State assisting the PM” and replacing them with “Minister for Sports and Minister for State assisting the PM”; and:—

(ii) in Column 4 by inserting in chronological order the following paragraphs:—

“*Places of Entertainment Act*” (Chapter 319);
 “*Professional Boxing Control Board Act 1981*”;
 “*Papua New Guinea Sports Commission Act 1992*”,
 “*South Pacific Games (1991) Foundation Act 1989*”; and

(iii) in Column 3—

(A) by inserting the following new paragraphs:—

“(f) National Sports Council; and
 “(g) Recreational Reserve Trust; and
 “(h) Papua New Guinea Sports Commission; and

- (B) by deleting “.” and substituting in its stead “; and ”; and
- (iv) in Column 2 by deleting the words “Minister of State assisting the PM” and substituting in their stead the following: “Minister for Sports and Minister of State assisting the PM”.
