DECLARATION OF PNG LNG MARINE TERMINAL

I, Ray Paul Commissioner of Customs, by virtue of the powers conferred on me by Section 7 of the *Customs Act* and the related legislations, hereby appoint the place described in Schedule 1 of this instrument and more specifically shown on the sketched hereto, as a limited port for the purposes specified in Schedule 2.

SCHEDULE 1

Land fall is marked as 09 degrees 20' 12.67" south, 147 degrees 0' 32.78" east, then a straight line bearing approximately 265 degrees along the centre line of the trestle to a point on a line connected by the following coordinates: 09 degrees 20' 19.99" south, 146 degrees 59' 13.73" east and 09 degrees 20' 21.36" south, 146 degrees 59' 14.23" east. This marks the end of the trestle. The area after this line is known as the LNG/Condensate loading berth connected by catwalks to the north and south.

The north catwalk connected to the LNG/Condensate loading berth by the following dolphins: BD2-09 degrees 20' 20.20" south, 146 degrees 59' 12.28" east, then to BD1-09 degrees 20' 19.21 south, 146 degrees 59' 11.91 east then to MD-3 -09 degrees 20' 17.20" south, 146 degrees 59' 12.48" east then to MD1-09 degrees 20' 14.75" south, 146 degrees 59' 11.58" east.

The south catwalk connected to the LNG/Condensate loading berth by the following coordinates: BD3 - 09 degrees 20' 21.76" south, 146 degrees 59' 12.85" east then to BD4 - 09 degrees 20' 22.75" south, 146 degrees 59' 13.22" east then to MD4 - 09 degrees 20' 23.93" south, 146 degrees 59' 14.95" east to MD6 - 09 degrees 20' 26.38" south, 146 degrees 59' 15.84" east.

SCHEDULE 2

The Jetty (PNG LNG Marine Terminal) is specifically to be used exclusively for boarding of vessels contracted for the Papua New Guinea Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) Project or its Agents for exportation of LNG, naphtha (condensate) and LPG only.

The appointment of this port has effect from 26th March, 2014 and maybe revoked by a subsequent notice from the Commissioner of Customs.
