re:	Enrolment of Persons as Law Practitioners
	(the Law Practitioners Act 1989).

- 1. Enrolment as a Law Practitioner is governed by section 5 of the Law Practitioners Act 1989.
- 2. The Chief Justice may enrol a person if the Chief Justice is satisfied -
 - "(a) that the person has sufficient professional knowledge and experience and raining in a common law jurisdiction; and
 - (b) as to the persons character and his suitability to be a law practitioner; and
 - (c) that the person intends to practise in Tonga as a law practitioner."
- 3. I wish to formalise and regularise the procedure for application for enrolment.
- 4. In future such Applications should be made in writing to this Court and should be accompanied by an Affidavit, made by the Applicant, setting out:-
 - (a) the full names and the date of birth of the Applicant;
 - (b) in detail the applicant's professional knowledge, experience and training and annexing, where appropriate, certificates and /or other documentation showing relevant qualifications, experigence and training.
 - (c) whether the Applicant has any criminal or quasi criminal convictions or not; and, if the Applicant has any such conviction(s), the dates, places, penalties and other circumstances of such conviction(s);
