

Correctional jurisdiction, 30<sup>th</sup> August, 1912.

The year 1912, 30<sup>th</sup> August at 9 a.m. the joint court composed of Messrs. The President; the French judge; the British judge; in the presence of the Public Prosecutor; Mr. Beugel, Registrar, recording, delivered the following judgment:

Consideration:

Considering that Mr. Leon Theuil, although well and duly summoned, does not appear; that it is necessary in consequence, to pronounce default against him for failure to appear;

The case:

Having heard read the documents in the case, no one for the defendant, we word added, considering that <sup>from</sup> the debates, the documents in the case, the depositions <sup>of</sup> <sub>this</sub> under oath... of the witnesses summoned, it is established that Leon Theuil did, in March and April 1911 at a place known as Pancuma, island of Maule, New Hebrides archipelago, sell dynamite cartridges to natives of the New Hebrides, offence provided for and punished by articles 57 and two hundred and six b1 of the Convention of 1906 as follows: "No person shall sell or supply arms or ammunition to the natives either directly or indirectly in the New Hebrides subject to the specific exceptions hereafter enumerated... 3) The present prohibitions shall extend... and all kinds of explosives... 6) Any breach by non-natives of articles 57... shall be punishable by a fine of from 1/- to £20.

For these reasons:

The court, having deliberated, judging by default, in public hearing, in first and last resort, condemns, by default, Leon Theuil to a fine of £2. and all costs.
