JOINT REGULATION 24 of 1964

JOINT REGULATION

No. 24 of
1964.

To prohibit the importation of pork from Portugal and Spain.

Joint Regulation No. 24 of 1964 was published in Condominium Gazette No. 224 and is reprinted as amended by Joint Regulation No. 12 of 1965 (Gazette No. 231).]

MADE by the British and French Resident Commissioners under the provisions of paragraph 2 of Article 2 and Article 7 of the Anglo-French Protocol of 1914.

1. No person shall for the time being import into the New Hebrides any kind of fresh or frozen pork, pigs' offal or pork products which originate from [—], Portugal or Spain:

Provided that the provisions of this section shall not apply to canned products.

2. No person shall bring ashore from any ship in a New Hebrides port or land from any aircraft at a New Hebrides airport any waste food matter coming from outside the New Hebrides.

3. Any person who contravenes the provisions of this Regulation shall be guilty of an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding £Stg. 50 or its equivalent in francs at the current rate of exchange.

4. This Regulation may be cited as the Joint Prohibition of Pork Imports Regulation No. 24 of 1964 and shall be operative from the date of signature.
