### TRANSFER OF POWERS REGULATION

1980

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

The purpose of this Regulation is to give the President power to adapt laws made before Independence so that provision is made for changes in offices brought about by Independence. For example some functions exercised by the Resident Commissioners may be exercised after Independence either by the President, the Prime Minister, a Minister or other officer.

A time limit is put on the President's power under Section 3 but Parliament may extend the time limit if it sees fit.

# ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

### RESOLUTION No. OF 1980

To provide for transfor of statutory functions and powers.

The Representative Assembly at its sitting on the day of 1980 heroby resolves and decides in accordance with Article 23 of the Schedule to the Exchange of Notes of 15th September 1977 to adopt the following measures:

Power of President to transfer powers, duties or functions. 1. Where by any Regulation the exercise of any power or the performance of any duty or function is vested in any person or body the President acting on the advice of the Council of Ministers may by order transfer the exercise of such power or the performance of such duty or function to the President, a Minister, public officer or other person as may be specified in the order.

Power of President to substitute reference to officers or persons. 2. The President may on the edvice of the Council of Ministers by order substitute with effect from a date specified in the order for any reference to a public officer or other person made in a Regulation a reference to the President, Minister, public officer or other person as may be specified in the order.

3. The powers under sections 1 and 2 shall be exerciable for a period of one year from the Day of Independence unless before the end of that period Parliament extends such period by such time as shall be given in the resolution.
