An Ordinance

made by the Administrator of the Territory of Western Samoa with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of that Territory, and in pursuance of the Samoa Constitution Order, 1920.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Land for Water Supply Purposes Ordinance, 1921.
2. In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by clause 261 of the Samoa Constitution Order, 1920, and of all other powers and authorities thereto enabling the pieces of land described in the schedule hereto, are hereby taken for the purpose of a water supply catchment area and for any other public purpose ancillary thereto.

THE SCHEDULE.

erty known as "Alaoa" Vol. VI. ff 669-670, an approximate distance of 3,000 metres more or less (150 chains) to the intersection of boundary line between "Alaoa" and land held by Seumanatafa Vol. 6 pp. 269, 270, at a point about 150 metres (7½ chains) on the said boundary line from the north-west corner of Tofaeono's property; thence slightly west of south through Seumanatafa's property above noted a distance of about 1,500 metres (75 chains) to the intersection of the boundary of Seumanatafa's property and land leased to Gurr Vol. VI. f 707 at a point about mid way along such boundary line; thence southerly and easterly along the watershed through the property leased by Gurr above noted to the south-west corner of Tofaeono's property Vol. VI. ff 669-670 a distance of 2,500 metres (125 chains); thence along the south and east boundary of Tofaeono's property above-noted as far as the junction of this property with the D.H. & P.G. land part Court Grant No. 132, a distance of about 1,200 metres (60 chains); thence along the south boundary of the D.H. and

P.G. land above noted to where such boundary touches land held under Court Grant 930, a distance of 4,300 metres (215 chains) to crater; thence through the D. H. and P.G. land in a north-westerly direction along the watershed between the eastern branch of the Vaisigano River and the Vaivaso River, a distance of 4,500 metres (225 chains) to the intersection of the south boundary of the property known as "Sina" native land, thence continuing in a direction slightly west of north through "Sina" native land a distance of 1,200 metres (60 chains) to the south boundary of native land known as "Letolo"; thence in the same direction through above noted land "Letolo" 240 metres (12 chains) and native land known as "Luagutu" 500 metres (25 chains) to intersection with south boundary of native lands "Vaopipi"; thence along the south boundary of "Vaopipi" in a westerly direction 340 metres (17 chains) to starting point at river junction. The same land is more particularly delineated and described on the plan filed in the office of the Chief Surveyor, Apia.
